LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

IT HAS BEEN A WHILE—ACTUALLY IT HAS BEEN FOURTEEN MONTHS— SINCE WE STARTED EMPTYING THE ENTIRE CONTENTS OF THE MUSEUM BUILDING. TONS OF UNWANTED OR UN-NEEDED STUFF WAS SENT TO BE RECYCLED, MATERIAL WAS WRAPPED AND PACKED AND SENT TO STORAGE, AND THE FIRE TRUCKS WERE STORED AWAY IN THE WAREHOUSE. ALL OF THE CEILINGS HAVE BEEN REMOVED, THE ROOF HAS BEEN REPLACED, THE IRON FRAMEWORK FOR THE ROOF HAS BEEN CLEANED AND PAINTED WHITE, NEW LIGHTING AND FANS INSTALLED, AND THE INTERIOR OF THE BUILDING HAS BEEN COMPLETELY REPAINTED IN A TWO TONE GRAY, LIGHT ON THE WALLS WITH A DARKER TRIM. THE BATHROOMS AND KITCHEN HAVE BEEN REPAINTED, AND THANKS TO A VERY GENEROUS DONATION, A DISHWASHER IS BEING INSTALLED.

THE “DISPLAY ROOM” HAS BEEN SET UP FOR VIEWING WITH SOME OF THE DISPLAYS REWORKED AND/OR RELOCATED. THE FIRE ENGINES HAVE NOT YET BEEN MOVED INTO THE “APPARATUS ROOM”, BUT PROBABLY BY THE TIME YOU READ THIS, THEY TOO WILL BE IN THEIR PLACE. AS YOU MUST KNOW FROM PRIOR EDITIONS OF THE NEWSLETTER, WE WERE ABLE TO DO THE ROOF WORK BECAUSE OF A VERY LARGE DONATION OF COMMUNITY PRESERVATION COMMISSION FUNDS THAT WERE VOTED BY HINGHAM TOWN MEETING MEMBERS. ALL OF THE OTHER WORK WAS PAID FOR BY THE MUSEUM, AND THE WORK WAS DONE BY MUSEUM MEMBERS. TO SAY THAT WE ARE DONE WOULD BE AN UNDERSTATEMENT OF HUGE PROPORTIONS. THERE STILL REMAINS WORK TO BE DONE IN THE AREAS THAT THE PUBLIC DOESN’T GET TO SEE. WE WILL BE GLAD TO HAVE YOUR HELP.

ON SEPTEMBER 22ND, OUR FAMILY USED THE MUSEUM TO HAVE A FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY PARTY FOR JO AND ME. IT PROVED TO BE AN OUTSTANDING PARTY FOR US, WITH LOTS OF FAMILY AND GOOD FRIENDS. DURING THE EVENING, HINGHAM FIRE CHIEF, AND MUSEUM MEMBER, MARK DUFF ASKED IF HE COULD SAY SOMETHING. HE ASKED JO TO JOIN HIM AS HE PRESENTED, AND SHE PINNED ME WITH A GOLD BADGE FOR THE POSITION OF “HONORARY CHIEF HINGHAM FIRE DEPARTMENT.” THIS WAS AN EXTREME SURPRISE AND A GREAT HONOR, ONE THAT CANNOT BE TAKEN LIGHTLY. THANK YOU CHIEF DUFF.



LETTER FROM THE TREASURER

HEY FOLKS! SUMMER IS OVER AND I, FOR ONE, WILL MISS THE WARMER WEATHER! BUT, THOUGHTS TURN TO THINGS WE NEED TO PAY ATTENTION TO AS THE WEATHER TURNS COLDER AND COLDER. HOPEFULLY WE WILL SEE A LOWER OIL BILL THIS WINTER DUE TO THE NEW ROOF THAT IS FINALLY, OR NEAR FINALLY, FINISHED. I KEEP HOPING THE COST OF OIL WILL COME DOWN TO A LESS HEADACHE INDUCING PRICE, BUT THIS IS JUST A FANTASY. THAT THE TWO FURNACES WILL FUNCTION AT A HIGHER LEVEL OF EFFICIENCY IS FANTASY, AS WELL.

OTHER MUSEUMS AND HISTORICAL INSTITUTIONS ARE ALL IN THE SAME BOAT WHEN IT COMES TO HAVING THE WHERE WITH ALL TO PAY THEIR EXPENSES, IMPROVE THEIR DISPLAYS AND COLLECTIONS, AND MAKE NEEDED REPAIRS TO THEIR BRICK AND MORTAR. SOME HAVE BEGUN CAPITAL CAMPAIGNS IN THE MILLIONS OF DOLLARS.





BARE COVE FIRE MUSEUM SELECTED MINUTES FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING SEPTEMBER 10, 2012

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER WITH BOARD MEMBERS DAVE CLARK, JACK CRANDALL, LISA ANDRE, DONALD LINCOLN, RUSSELL CLARK, GINNY GRAY AND GERI DUFF.

THE MINUTES FROM THE MARCH 13TH WERE READ AND ACCEPTED.

VICE PRESIDENT JACK CRANDALL RECEIVED THE MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION FOR LINDA ILLES OF NORTH WEYMOUTH. HE ALSO REPORTED THAT ALL LOCKS HAVE BEEN CLEANED AND REPAIRED WHERE NEEDED. ADAM READ SAID THAT HE WOULD BE MORE THAN HAPPY TO ANSWER ANY LATE NIGHT ALARMS AND HE WILL BE ADDED TO THE CALL LIST. DAVE WILL PROVIDE THE LIST TO PATRIOT ALARM.

TREASURER LISA ANDRE REPORTED THE FINANCES YEAR TO DATE, THE TAX RETURNS HAVE BEEN FILED WITH HELP FROM GARY McDONOUGH, CPA AND THE SOLICITATION FOR FUNDS FORM WILL COME ONCE THE RETURN HAS BEEN PROCESSED. SHE NOTED THAT IF WE DO A MAJOR RAFFLE THERE IS A FEE INVOLVED WITH THE STATE.

PRESIDENT DAVE CLARK REPORTED THAT EVERYTHING IN THE MUSEUM BUILDING HAS BEEN PAINTED; KITCHEN AND BATHROOMS FLOORS HAVE BEEN WASHED AND WAXED; A BRAND NEW DISHWASHER AND THE SERVICES OF A PLUMBER HAVE BEEN DONATED; A PROFESSIONAL PAINTER DID THE HIGH REACHES IN THE KITCHEN/STAIRWAY AREA AND THE LIGHTING NEEDS TWEAKING, BUT IS DONE. LISA WILL WORK WITH DAVE TO FIND AN ELECTRICIAN TO DO THE WORK. DON LINCOLN PROVIDED AND HANK THORNTON ADAPTED A SAFETY RAILING FOR THE TWO STEPS BETWEEN THE DISPLAY AND APPARATUS ROOMS. THE UPSTAIRS NEEDS TO BE FINISHED WITH PAINTING, SECURING WALLS AND ETC. THE THREE SMALL ROOMS OFF THE DISPLAY ROOM HAVE BEEN PAINTED. A HATCH WILL BE INSTALLED TO FACILITATE ACCESS TO FURNACE PUMP IN ATTIC. THE REAR WALL STILL NEEDS TO BE CORRECTED AND THE CONTRACTOR HAS A FEW SMALL ITEMS TO FINISH. A SHELF WILL BE ADDED OVER THE WORKBENCH FOR A DISPLAY OF THE LARGER FIRE EXTINGUISHERS.

CURATOR'S REPORT: A GIFT OF A CO2 EXTINGUISHER WAS RECEIVED FROM KATHLEEN OF HULL. IT SEEMS THAT NOT A MONTH GOES BY WITHOUT A DONATION WALKING IN THE DOOR THESE DAYS. WE HAVE STARTED HIGHLIGHTING SOME OF THEM IN THE DISPLAY ROOM.

COMPUTER: GERI REMINDED THE BOARD THAT SHE IS WILLING TO TRAIN MEMBERS TO USE THE PASTPERFECT MUSEUM PROGRAM. THE BCFM BOARD VOTED TO HAVE LISA ANDRE RENEW THE CARBONITE CONTRACT TO STORE BCFM COMPUTER WORK OFF SITE FOR ONE YEAR.

AS A MEMBER OF THE BACK ROADS OF THE SOUTH SHORE, THE BCFM ATTENDS MONTHLY MEETINGS AND HAS VOTED TO HOST A MEETING IN THE SPRING. ANY BOARD MEMBER IS WELCOME TO ATTEND THESE MONTHLY MEETINGS.

AN OPEN HOUSE IS PLANNED FOR OCTOBER 28TH FROM 1-4.

THE BCFM HAS BEEN INVITED TO HELP CELEBRATE THE 125TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE GAR HALL IN HINGHAM. PRESIDENT CLARK WILL PRESENT A MEDAL FOUND IN THE ARCHIVES TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE GAR HALL AT THIS TIME.

GERI WILL TALK TO SCOUTMASTER PHIL RECSA TO SEE ABOUT HAVING TROOP 52 JOIN IN ON SOME OF OUR EVENTS.

BARE COVE FIRE MUSEUM SELECTED MINUTES FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING OCTOBER 9, 2012

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER WITH BOARD MEMBERS DAVE CLARK, JACK CRANDALL, LISA ANDRE, RUSSELL CLARK, AND GERI DUFF.

THE MINUTES FROM THE SEPTEMBER 10TH WERE READ AND ACCEPTED.

ONCE THE COMPUTER ROOM IS SET, THE MAIN COMPUTER WILL BE PUT IN PLACE AND BE AVAILABLE FOR VOLUNTEERS TO HELP WITH THE INVENTORY AND OTHER PROJECTS.

GERI AND LISA WILL ATTEND THE NEXT BACK ROADS OF THE SOUTH SHORE MEETING IN KINGSTON ON FRIDAY THE 12TH AND REPORT BACK AT THE NEXT BCFM BOARD MEETING.

VICE PRESIDENT JACK CRANDALL HAD NO CHANGES TO THE MEMBERSHIP THIS MONTH. HE WILL BE WORKING ON THE ARCHIVE STORAGE DOOR TO PROVIDE A LOCK THERE. DAVE HAS AN UPDATED KEY AND PASSCODE LIST.

TREASURER LISA ANDRE REPORTED SHE HAS CHANGED THE BCFM MAILING ADDRESS TO 45 BARE COVE PARK DRIVE ON MOST OF THE INCOMING BILLS. SHE HAS PLACED IN THE ARCHIVES ALL FINANCIAL RECORDS BELONGING TO THE BCFM.

PRESIDENT DAVE CLARK REPORTED ON PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT STATUS. VICTOR BERNAN WILL BE CUTTING A HATCH IN THE FURNACE ROOM CEILING FOR ACCESS TO THE DEAD STORAGE SPACE. VICTOR WILL BE HANGING A LIFE NET FROM THE CEILING IN THE APPARATUS ROOM. HE WILL ALSO BE CLEANING OUT THE BACK ROOM, WIRE BRUSHING AND PAINTING. AS IT IS AN UNHEATED ROOM IT WILL MOST LIKELY BE USED FOR STORAGE OF TABLES AND CHAIRS. DAVE MENTIONED THAT

THE DISHWASHER NEEDS TO BE INSTALLED AND A NEW COUNTER IS NEEDED. VICTOR PLANS TO REMOVE THE DOORWAY AND WALL SECTION OF THE LEFT OF THE STOVE TO PROVIDE MORE KITCHEN WORK SPACE. DAVE THEN MENTIONED THAT UPSTAIRS IN THE ARCHIVES THE SHEETROCK NEEDS TO BE RIPPED OUT TO SHOW THE BRICK AND THE CENTER WALL NEEDS TO BE ANCHORED.

THE BCFM RECENTLY WAS THE VENUE FOR AN ANNIVERSARY PARTY THAT CATERED TO ABOUT 100 PEOPLE AND WAS PERFECT.

CURATOR NEWS: BROOK AND MEG ROBBINS DONATED A QUALITY REPLICA FIRE MARK OF THE PHILADELPHIA CONTRIBUTIONSHIP WHICH WILL BE PLACED IN THE FIRE MARK DISPLAY SLATED FOR THE APPARATUS ROOM. A DEED OF GIFT HAS BEEN SIGNED USING THE NEW PASTPERFECT SYSTEM.

BARE COVE FIRE MUSEUM OPEN HOUSE WILL BE SUNDAY, OCTOBER 28TH FROM 1 TO 4 PM. WE ASK THAT ALL MUSEUM MEMBERS THAT HAVE THE WHITE SHIRT UNIFORMS PLEASE WEAR THEM AND ANDY ADDOMS WILL BE ASKED TO WEAR THE RED SHIRT. THE TRUCKS WILL BE OUT (HOPE FOR GOOD WEATHER) AND CIDER, GINGERSNAPS, CHEESE AND CRACKERS WILL BE SERVED.

THERE WILL BE A SMALL WELCOMING SPEECH GIVEN BY PRESIDENT CLARK AT 1:30PM.

ONE OF THE NEW ADDITIONS TO THE DISPLAY ROOM IS A COLLECTION OF MEMORABILIA OF MANY OF THE EARLIER FIREMEN'S BALLS HELD IN HINGHAM TO RAISE FUNDS FOR THE FIREMEN'S RELIEF ASSOCIATION. THESE WERE CATALOGED AND ARRANGED BY CAITLIN DOYLE, A SUMMER INTERN, GERI DUFF AND DAVE CLARK.

WITH THE DISPLAY IS A BINDER CONTAINING COPIES OF ARTICLES THAT WERE PRINTED IN THE HINGHAM JOURNAL COMPILED BY ROBERT OLSEN, HINGHAM FIREFIGHTER AND MEMBER OF THE BARE COVE FIRE MUSEUM. HE MADE EVERY EFFORT TO RECORD ANY MENTION OF THE HINGHAM FIRE DEPARTMENT IN NEWSPAPERS AND FIRE COMPANY RECORDS.

IN THE EARLY YEARS, FIRE COMPANIES OFTEN HELD DINNERS TO STRENGTHEN THE BONDS OF FRIENDSHIP THAT LED TO STRONG TEAMWORK IN FIGHTING FIRES. THE MEN DID ALL THE ORGANIZING OF DINNERS, DANCES AND OTHER SOCIAL ACTIVITIES. OVER TIME, THE TRADITION OF THE ANNUAL BALL WAS CREATED. THE MEN WORE THE BADGES AND RIBBONS THAT PROCLAIMED THEIR ROLE IN PUTTING ON A MEMORABLE BALL. WOMEN CARRIED THE DANCE CARDS AND WROTE DOWN THE MEN THEY DANCED WITH AS A SOUVENIR OF A NIGHT OF DINNER AND DANCING.



TODAY WOMEN ARE ON THE FIRE FRONT AND ARE PART OF THE ORGANIZING THAT MAKES FOR A STRONG TEAM. DURING SOCIAL EVENTS, FIREFIGHTER'S FAMILIES BECOME A PART OF THE BONDS OF FRIENDSHIP THAT SUPPORT THE TEAMWORK THAT IS SO IMPORTANT IN TODAY'S FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE AND TO ALL OF THEM WE SAY THANK YOU AND MAY YOU EVER BE STRONG.
