LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

THIS HAS BEEN A BUSY FALL AT THE MUSEUM, WITH THE BARN SALE, THE BAKE SALES, FIREHOUSE NIGHT, THE CONTINUING WORK ON THE BUNNY WAGON AND THE ARCHIVE ROOM. THERE HAS BEEN A SPECIAL SUB-COMMITTEE WORKING WITH HINGHAM HISTORICAL COMMISSION AND THE COMMUNITY PRESERVATION COMMITTEE. COFFEE/BAKE SALE

ARCHIVE ROOM UPDATE

THE ARCHIVE ROOM IS FINALLY TAKING SHAPE! THE WALLS ARE PAINTED A VERY PALE GREEN, THE CEILING IS PAINTED WHITE (BUT REALLY NEEDS TO HAVE A HUNG CEILING INSTALLED WITH INSULATION ABOVE IT), THE WHITE TRIM NEEDS A SECOND COAT, AND THE PERIMETER OF THE FLOOR HAS TWO COATS OF PAINT WHICH MATCHES WHAT IS IN THE DISPLAY ROOM. AS SOON AS WE ARE ABLE, WE WILL START TO SET UP THE ROOM WITH SOME OF THE ITEMS WE ALREADY HAVE. FOUR BRAND NEW FILING CABINETS ARE BEING DONATED, AS WELL AS A DESK AND TWO COMFY CHAIRS. A BRAND NEW ELECTRICAL HEAT REGISTER NEEDS TO BE INSTALLED, AS WELL.

A DUMP RUN OR TWO NEED TO BE MADE. A VOLUNTEER OR TWO (WITH TWO WORKING ARMS AS OUR TREASURER DISLOCATED HER SHOULDER AND IS A TAD ON THE INJURED ROSTER) WOULD BE GREATLY APPRECIATED.



WITH THE ARCHIVE ROOM IN SOME SORT OF USABLE SHAPE, THE MIDDLE OF THE ROOM WILL BE USED TO STORE SOME OF THE MEMORABILIA FROM THE LARGER ROOM TO MAKE ROOM TO FINISH THE LARGER ROOM. ONE WALL NEEDS TO BE FINISHED WITH WALL BOARD AND THEN THE SEAMS ALL NEED TO BE COMPOUNDED—BUT THIS WILL HAVE TO WAIT UNTIL SPRING. GETTING THINGS READY TO PROCEED CAN START NOW...

THE THREE WINDOWS ON THE BACK WALL NEED TO BE REPLACED. SOME CARPENTRY WORK WILL NEED TO BE DONE TO ACCOMPLISH THIS. AND, THE HEAT PUMP GALEN HERSEY AQUIRED FOR US NEEDS TO BE INSTALLED.

ARCHIVE COLLECTION UPDATE

In the archive collection we have added computer copies of a photo album belonging to Albert H. Kimball, Jr., that was put together by his Uncle Jim and sister Judy. Picture #73 Bumpkin Island Hospital—Built and operated for crippled children by Mr. A. C. Burrage makes a nice companion to the photograph of the hospital after the fire in 1946 that we already have in the archives.



WE ALSO HAVE STARTED GATHERING PHOTOS AND MEMORABILIA OF THE AMMUNITION DEPOT FROM VARIOUS SOURCES. WE HAVE A COPY OF PAGE 22 OF THE 2004 JUNE ISSUE OF NAVAL HISTORY ABOUT A PIECE ON AMMUNITION FROM HINGHAM THAT ENDED UP AT THE BOTTOM OF THE ENGLISH CHANNEL, PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE HINGHAM SHIPYARD FIRE DEPARTMENT AND SOME OF THE MEN'S BADGES. WE HOPE TO HAVE ENOUGH FOR A DISPLAY OF THE AMMUNITION DEPOT IN THE NEAR FUTURE.



In 2002, the Naval Historical Center performed underwater surveys of the channel floor near Normandy. One of its finds was the sunken gallant destroyer Meredith, which struck a mine on 8 June and succumbed to a German bomber, which finished her off after she had lost 7 killed and more than 50 wounded or missing. This is a digital image taken by a remotely powered vehicle of a 5-inch/38-caliber shell casing from the ship.

COMMUNITY PRESERVATION COMMITTEE (CPC) UPDATE










Scenes from the 2009 Quincy Christmas Parade Thanks to everyone who participated! The museum's float won the third place \$500 prize.









BARE COVE FIRE MUSEUM BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING OCTOBER 13, 2009

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: 7:37 PM

In attendance: Dave Clark, Russell Clark, Jack Crandall, Robin Bernan, Jaclyn Howard, Geri Duff, Lisa Andre, Guest Insurance Agent Bruce Thompson.

PRESIDENT DAVE CLARK THANKED ALL VOLUNTEERS WHO PARTICIPATED IN THE BARN SALE AND BAKE SALE, PLUS A SPECIAL THANK YOU TO TRACY DUFF FOR THE NEWSLETTER SHE PUT TOGETHER FOR THE MUSEUM.

INSURANCE AGENT BRUCE THOMPSON PROVIDED THE BOARD WITH DETAILED INFORMATION ON THE COVERAGE AND COSTS THAT THE MUSEUM HAS AND ANSWERED ALL QUESTIONS THE BOARD HAD.

CLERK'S REPORT: THE MINUTES OF THE SEPTEMPBER 8, 2009, SPECIAL BOARD MEETING AND THE MONTHLY BOARD MEETING WERE READ AND ACCEPTED.

TREASURER LISA ANDRE PROVIDED THE BOARD WITH DETAILED ACCOUNT OF INCOME AND EXPENSES FROM APRIL THROUGH OCTOBER 13TH.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: 7:39 PM

IN ATTENDANCE: DAVE CLARK, RUSS CLARK, ROBIN BERNAN, JACLYN HOWARD, LISA ANDRE, TRACY DUFF, SAMANTHA ROSE HOWARD, GERI DUFF.

PRESIDENT DAVE CLARK THANKED ALL VOLUNTEERS FOR A GREAT FIREHOUSE NIGHT PLUS A SPECIAL THANK YOU TO VICTOR BERNAN, DANA MCDONOUGH, TREASURER LISA ANDRE, AND ROCKLAND CHIEF ROBERT DIPOLI FOR THEIR DONATIONS TO THE RAFFLE TABLE.

CLERK'S REPORT: THE MINUTES OF THE OCTOBER 13TH MEETING WERE READ AND ACCEPTED.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT: JACK CRANDALL WAS NOT AVAILABLE.

TREASURER ANDRE PROVIDED THE BOARD WITH A DETAILED ACCOUNT OF INCOME AND EXPENSES FROM APRIL THROUGH NOVEMBER 10TH.

JACK HALLIDAY GAVE THE MUSEUM \$100.00 TO MAKE A DONATION TO THE HINGHAM 375TH CEL-EBRATION TO PUT THE MUSEUM'S NAME ON THE DONOR LIST.

TREASURER ANDRE DID NOT HAVE A COPY OF THE OCTOBER SECURITY REPORT FOR THIS MEETING BUT WILL PROVIDE IT LATER.

CURATOR'S REPORT: BOB STELLA WAS NOT AVAILABLE.

COMMUNITY PRESERVATION COMMITTEE REPORT: TREASURER ANDRE DID CONSIDERABLE RESEARCH VIA PHONE AND FAX WITH SEVERAL MILITARY INFORMATIONAL AGENCIES AND PUT TOGETHER A PACKET OF INFORMATION AND PHOTOGRAPHS REGARDING THE USE OF THE MUSEUM WHEN IT WAS A FILLING STATION FOR AMMUNITION. SHE PRESENTED ALL HER FINDINGS TO THE HINGHAM HISTORICAL COMMISSION (HHC) WHO WERE DELIGHTED WITH HER WORK AND ASKED THAT THE MUSEUM CONSIDER SETTING UP A SMALL DISPLAY WITHIN THE MUSEUM SHOWING THE BUILDING'S HISTORY. SHE WILL BE GOING BACK TO RECEIVE A LETTER FROM THE HHC STATING THAT THE

BUILDING IS OF HISTORIC INTEREST AND BE PLACED IN THE TOWN'S INVENTORY OF SAID BUILDINGS. NEXT VISITS WILL BE TO THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE AND THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN.

OPENINGS: THERE WAS DISCUSSION ABOUT HAVING THE MUSEUM OPEN ON WEEKENDS AND THE BEST WAY TO PROMOTE THIS AMONG THE MEMBERSHIP. THIS WILL BE REVIEWED FURTHER AT UPCOMING MEETINGS.

NIAGARA BELL: ALEC MACMILLAN OF THE HINGHAM HISTORICAL COMMISSION PAID A VISIT TO THE MUSEUM AND WAS SUITABLY IMPRESSED WITH THE DISPLAYS OF HINGHAM FIRE MEMORABILIA TO THE POINT THAT WHEN HE LATER MET WITH HINGHAM INSTITUTION FOR SAVINGS PRESIDENT ROBERT H. GAUGHEN, JR., HE ASKED IF THE BANK WOULD GIVE THE MUSEUM THE NIAGARA FIRE BELL THEY CURRENTLY HAVE IN THEIR CUPOLA. MR. GAUGHEN SAID YES. SEVERAL BOARD MEMBERS WILL LOOK INTO THE ISSUE AND REPORT BACK.

PHONES: THE BUILDING PHONE IS NOT WORKING CORRECTLY AND TREASURER ANDRE WILL LOOK INTO IT.

DRIVERS: ONLY THOSE LISTED ON THE INSURANCE POLICY MAY BE ALLOWED TO DRIVE THE VEHICLES. SINCE THERE'S A DEARTH OF YOUNGER PEOPLE ON THE LIST, THERE WILL BE DRIVER TRAINING FOR ELIGIBLE PERSONS. VICTOR BERNAN WILL BEGIN TRAINING RICK PEGURRI.

WEB SITE: THE MAILING ADDRESS WILL BE ADDED TO THE SITE AND GERI DUFF WILL PROVIDE BRENDAN HOWARD WITH A PHOTOGRAPH TO MATCH THE AHRENS-FOX TEXT.

ADDRESSES: A COMPLETE LIST OF ADDRESS IS BEING COMPILED FOR FUTURE USE IN MAILING NEWSLETTERS, MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS, AND EVENT INVITATIONS.

CLEANING: PRESIDENT CLARK, SCOTTY MACMILLAN, MARK DUFF AND OTHERS HAVE BEEN WORKING ON CLEARING AWAY DEBRIS THAT HAS BEEN DUMPED AROUND THE BUILDING. SCOTTY WILL KEEP THE GRASS MOWED IF IT IS CLEAR OF RUBBISH.

TREASURER ANDRE HAS THE LETTER FROM THE HINGHAM MUNICIPAL LIGHT PLANT GIVING THE MUSEUM CUSTODY OF THE LIGHT POLES STACKED NEAR THE MUSEUM BUILDING AND WILL GIVE IT TO THE PRESIDENT.
