LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

YOU ALL KNOW ABOUT BEING BUSY, WE ALL HAVE THOSE FAMILY THINGS THAT HAVE TO BE DONE—SOME OF THEM OVER AND OVER AGAIN. THERE ARE THE KIDS TO FERRY AROUND, THE GRASS TO CUT, CARS TO WASH, HOUSE KEEPING TO DO, CHICKENS TO TEND, AND DID SOMEONE SAY "LET'S HAVE A BARN SALE"? BUT, IT ALL GETS DONE.



**BARE COVE FIRE MUSEUM SELECTED MINUTES FROM THE
BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MAY 11, 2010**

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: 7:30 PM

IN ATTENDANCE: DAVE CLARK, LISA ANDRE, RUSSELL CLARK, ROBIN BERNAN, JACLYN HOWARD, JACK CRANDALL, DON LINCOLN AND GERI DUFF

CLERK'S REPORT: THE MINUTES OF THE APRIL 13TH MEETING WERE READ AND ACCEPTED.

VICE PRESIDENT CRANDALL REPORTED THAT THE MEMBERSHIP HAS 80+ PAID MEMBERS.

THERE WAS NOTHING NEW TO REPORT FROM THE CURATOR.

EQUIPMENT & PROPERTY STATUS: PRESIDENT CLARK SPOKE ABOUT THE RESTORATION OF ENGINE 3, THE BUNNY WAGON. HE REPORTED THAT THE SEATS AND A FEW SMALL PIECES OF THE TRUCK WERE GIVEN TO JOHN THOMAS TO START THE PAINTING PROCESS. HE SAID THAT JOHN THOMAS IS CONCERNED ABOUT THE CURRENT PRIMER AND THE APPEARANCE OF SOME DINGS AND DENTS THAT MAY AFFECT THE QUALITY OF THE PAINT JOB AND THIS MAY NEED TO BE CORRECTED.

PRESIDENT CLARK MENTIONED THAT THERE APPEARS TO BE WORMWOOD BEETLES IN BUILDING #52. A MUSEUM MEMBER HAS VOLUNTEERED TO LOOK INTO THE MATTER AND PRES. CLARK WILL REPORT BACK TO THE BOARD ON HIS FINDINGS.

TREASURER ANDRE'S REPORT WAS RECEIVED AND ACCEPTED.

THE FIREWOOD DERBY WAS A SMALL SUCCESS. AFTER SOME DISCUSSION IT WAS DECIDED NOT TO HOST ANOTHER UNTIL SUCH TIME AS NEW VOLUNTEERS STEP FORWARD TO ORGANIZE AND RUN THE EVENT.

TREASURER ANDRE REPORTED THAT THE ROOF REPLACEMENT PROJECT WAS APPROVED BY HINGHAM TOWN MEETING AND SHE IS AWAITING ADVICE FROM ANDREA YOUNG OF THE HISTORIC COMMISSION AS TO THE NEXT STEP IN THE PROCESS.

TREASURER ANDRE REPORTED THAT THE SALES OF RAFFLE TICKETS GOT OFF TO A GOOD START AND HANDED OUT TICKETS TO BOARD MEMBERS TO SELL. THE RAFFLE WILL BE HELD ON JULY 24TH AT THE END OF THE MUSEUM OPEN HOUSE AT 3 PM.

WEEKEND OPENINGS WERE DISCUSSED. AS SPRING AND SUMMER PROGRESS WE HOPE TO HAVE BETWEEN 2 AND 3 VOLUNTEERS ON HAND TO WELCOME VISITORS SUNDAY AFTERNOONS. DUFF, BERNAN AND ANDRE HAVE VOLUNTEERED TO OPEN THE MUSEUM SUNDAY AFTERNOON, MAY 16, FROM 1 TO 3 IF THE WEATHER IS GOOD.

SATURDAY, JUNE 12 HOPEFULLY WE WILL HAVE ACCESS TO THE OLD CENTRAL FIRE HOUSE ON SHORT STREET TO DISPLAY FIRE TRUCKS, PHOTOS AND MEMORABILIA DURING THE HINGHAM HISTORICAL SOCIETY'S HOUSE TOUR. THIS IS ALSO THE SAME DAY AS THE FLAG DAY PARADE IN QUINCY. THE TRUCKS NEED TO BE IN QUINCY BY 6:30 PM.

SUNDAY, JUNE 13, ENGINE 2, THE AHRENS-FOX IS REQUESTED FOR THE FIREFIGHTER'S SUNDAY AT HINGHAM FIRE HEADQUARTERS. IT IS ALSO THE 75TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ORIGINAL DELIVERY OF THIS PIECE.

GERI DUFF REPORTS THAT THE PREPARATION FOR THE JUNE 5TH BARN SALE IS ON TRACK.

THE PARADE COMMITTEE HAS PROPOSED A NUMBER OF FLOATS FOR THE JULY 4TH/375TH PARADE IN HINGHAM AND WILL PRESENT THIS AT THE ANNUAL MEETING.

AS PRESIDENT CLARK IS NOT AVAILABLE, ROBIN BERNAN WILL CHAIR THE ANNUAL MEETING, AT THE END OF WHICH IS THE ICE CREAM SOCIAL.

IT WAS VOTED TO INCLUDE THE NOTICE OF THE ANNUAL MEETING IN THE NEWSLETTER. THERE WAS DISCUSSION ABOUT THE NEWSLETTER. IT WILL BE REVIEWED BY THE BOARD PRIOR TO PRINTING AND INCLUDE ONLY THE MINUTES THAT HAVE BEEN APPROVED BY BOARD VOTE.

THE MUSEUM PROVIDED CHAIRS AND TABLES FOR THE DEDICATION OF THE STEVE CARLSON FIELDS ON MAY 1ST.

DON LINCOLN REPORTED THAT THE HINGHAM INSTITUTE FOR SAVINGS HAS STARED PREP WORK FOR THEIR NEW ADDITION. HOPEFULLY THE MUSEUM WILL BE ABLE TO SECURE THE OLD FIRE BELL FROM THEM FOR DISPLAY.

THERE WAS SOME DISCUSSION ABOUT PROVIDING A DISPLAY ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE BUILDING FOR THE GENERAL PUBLIC. THIS WILL BE LOOKED INTO.

THE MEETING ENDED AT 9:00 PM. THE NEXT BOARD MEETING WILL BE AT 7:30 PM, SEPTEMBER 14TH AT THE BARE COVE FIRE MUSEUM.

THE NEXT MUSEUM EVENT IS JUNE 9TH, THE ANNUAL MEETING.

BARE COVE FIRE MUSEUM SELECTED MINUTES FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING JUNE 9, 2010

THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE BARE COVE FIRE MUSEUM WAS CALLED TO ORDER AT 1945 HOURS BY PAST PRESIDENT ROBIN BERNAN WHEN IT WAS ESTABLISHED A QUORUM WAS PRESENT AS REQUIRED BY THE BYLAWS AND ACCORDING TO THE LAWS OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS.

AFTER WELCOMING EVERYONE IN ATTENDANCE, PAST PRESIDENT BERNAN ASKED FOR A MOMENT OF SILENCE FOR THOSE MEMBERS WHO ARE NO LONGER WITH US.

VOTED: TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES OF THE JUNE 2009 MEETING.

VOTED: THE TREASURER'S REPORT WAS READ AND ACCEPTED.

VOTED: THE VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT ON MEMBERSHIP WAS ACCEPTED.

FOR THE CURATOR IT WAS REPORTED THAT SEVERAL DONATIONS WERE MADE TO THE COLLECTION FROM VISITORS INCLUDING ENGINE PARTS AND PHOTOGRAPHS.

THE MECHANICS REPORT WAS GIVEN BY RUSSELL CLARK. THE MAXIM LADDER AND THE AHRENS FOX PUMPER ARE RUNNING WELL. THE BULK OF THE WORK THIS YEAR WAS DONE ON ENGINE 3. THE BARN SALE REPORT WAS GIVEN BY GERI DUFF.

JACLYN HOWARD REPORTED THAT THE TOWN OF HINGHAM IS CELEBRATING IT'S 375TH BIRTHDAY AND THE PLAN IS TO HAVE SEVERAL MUSEUM PIECES AND FLOATS IN THE 4TH OF JULY PARADE THIS YEAR UNDER THE HEADING OF "HISTORY OF FIREFIGHTING ON PARADE."

LISA ANDRE REPORTED THAT THE BARE COVE FIRE MUSEUM HAS BEEN AWARDED \$252,000 FOR BUILDING RESTORATION FROM THE COMMUNITY PRESERVATION ACT BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWN OF HINGHAM. SHE WILL CONTINUE WITH THE PROJECT.

THE FOLLOWING WERE PLACED IN NOMINATION: PRESIDENT: DAVE CLARK, VICE PRESIDENT: JACK CRANDALL, PAST PRESIDENT: ROBIN BERNAN, TREASURER: LISA ANDRE, CLERK: GERI DUFF, DIRECTOR AT LARGE: JACLYN HOWARD, DIRECTOR AT LARGE: DONALD LINCOLN. THERE BEING NO NOMINATIONS FROM THE FLOOR, THE CLERK, GERI DUFF WAS INSTRUCTED TO CAST ONE VOTE FOR EACH. DIRECTOR AT LARGE JOYCE OLSEN AND DIRECTOR AT LARGE RUSSELL CLARK WILL HAVE THEIR TERMS ENDING IN JUNE OF 2011.

IT WAS VOTED NOT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE HINGHAM HISTORICAL SOCIETY'S HOUSE TOUR DUE TO THE SHORT NOTICE GIVEN ON THE USE OF NUMBER EIGHT SHORT STREET.

A MOTION FROM THE FLOOR REQUESTED THE BOARD TO PURCHASE A LAWN MOWER. DON LINCOLN VOLUNTEERED TO PROCURE ONE AT NO COST WHICH WAS ACCEPTED FROM THE MEMBERSHIP BY VOICE VOTE.

THE MEETING ADJOURNED AT 2013 HOURS. RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED, GERI DUFF, CLERK.

**BARE COVE FIRE MUSEUM SELECTED MINUTES FROM THE
BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING SEPTEMBER 15, 2010**

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: 7:35 PM

IN ATTENDANCE: DAVE CLARK, RUSS CLARK, ROBIN BERNAN, JACLYN HOWARD, LISA ANDRE AND GERI DUFF

THE MINUTES FROM THE MAY AND AUGUST MEETINGS WERE READ AND ACCEPTED.

CURATOR'S REPORT: THE BCFM RECENTLY RECEIVED A GIFT FROM DICK KENNEY OF TEN 8X10 GLASS NEGATIVES OF ALL THE MOTORIZED HINGHAM FIRE COMPANIES IN THE 1920'S. MIKE CROWLEY OF WEYMOUTH FIRE DONATED A FOUR VOLUME SET OF THE HISTORY OF HINGHAM AND A COPY OF HINGHAM IN THE CIVIL WAR.
